Roosevelt Comes Back to 26 to 0 Decision From Washburn

A scrappy Roosevelt eleven came back yesterday on its own gridiron to trim the Washburn outfit by a 26 to 0 score.

Penalties near the enemy's goal line and a stubborn Washburn offensive that broke just in time to take the ball from the shadows of its own posts to near the center of the field several times halted Roosevelt scoring rallies in the first half, but the Teddies came back in the last two periods with a running attack that could not be stopped and scored two touchdowns in the third and fourth periods.

Rally is Stopped

The Millers started out to hold the Teddies in check but couldn't stop the running of the opposing ball carriers and Pat Grimes broke away from midfield for a 35-yard run early in the game. Two plays put the ball on the 10-yard line, but a penalty of 15 yards put the Teddies back and a placekick attempt failed.

Bruntlett and Fawcett opened up an air attack that for a while seemed destined to bring the chalk into use on the Miller scoreboard, but the Teddies learned the trick and rushed the passer so fast that the ball usually fell in safe territory.

Once again in the second period the Teddies came near scoring, but penalties set them back and the half ended a scoreless tie.

A mainstay in the game after his injury, was the spirit of the Miller team and often made good gains.

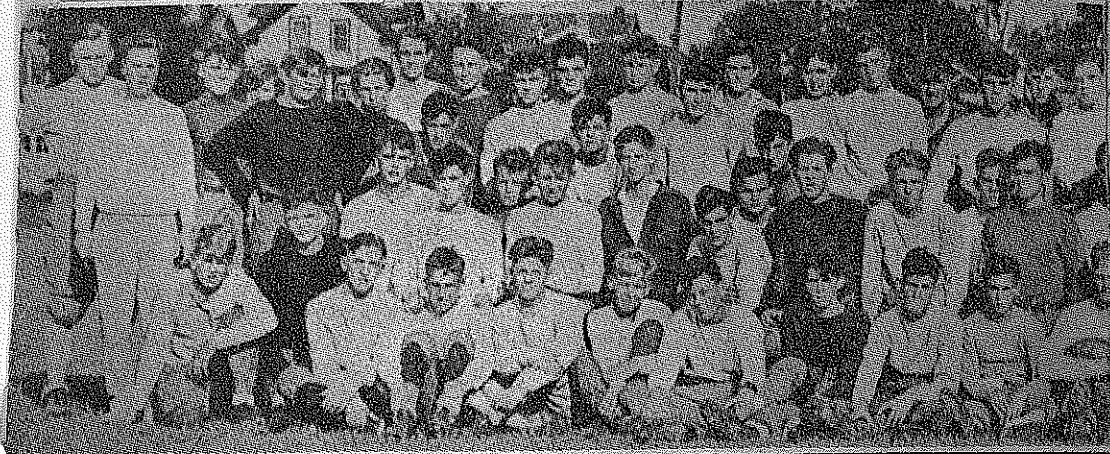
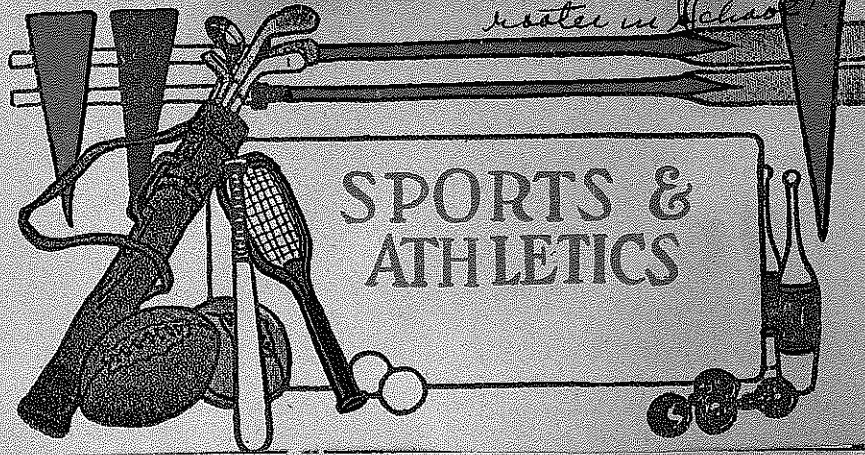
